



Fall Clean-Up for residential properties within the Municipality of the District of Yarmouth will be undertaken during October 2013. (As usual, standard dates being the first two Fridays and Saturdays in October.)

FALL CLEAN – UP COLLECTION DATES:

<u>DATE OF CLEANUP</u>	<u>NORMAL COLLECTION DAY IS:</u>	<i>Solid waste placed for collection shall be separated, packaged, or bundled and shall not exceed a total of 70 kilograms (155 lbs) in weight or over 2.0 meters (6 ½ feet) in any dimension up to a maximum of 2 cubic meters (2 ½ cubic yards) in volume. <u>Garbage must be placed in clear bags when bagging material.</u></i>

DUE TO THE LARGE AMOUNT OF WASTE TO BE COLLECTED OVER A SHORT PERIOD OF TIME, THE MUNICIPALITY OF YARMOUTH RESERVES THE RIGHT TO LIMIT QUANTITIES.

Accepted Items	Items <u>Not</u> Accepted
<p>The following list of items will be picked up during our Fall Clean-Up. Items must be separated into various groups for ease of pick up and disposal.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ oil tanks (must be cut in half) ▶ mattresses rolled and tied ▶ rugs/carpets (cut & rolled in manageable sizes) ▶ swing sets and trampolines must be dismantled ▶ hot water heaters ▶ household furniture ▶ lawn mowers (drained of oil and gasoline) ▶ BBQ's ▶ appliances and white goods <p><i>Refrigerators and freezers must have doors removed from the appliance. Only one major appliance per household from each group will be accepted for pick up i.e. one stove, one washer, one dryer, one hot water heater, etc.</i></p> <p>Tree limbs, brush (must be bundled in 3' lengths) <u>WILL</u> be accepted on <u>NORMAL</u> organic week pick ups.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ <u>ALL construction/renovation/demolition debris and waste material</u> (windows, plywood, wood products, etc.) ▶ explosives, combustible or toxic materials ▶ lobster traps ▶ paints and solvents, liquid wastes. Most household waste paint can be taken to Enviro-Depot or HHW depot for disposal ▶ <u>refillable</u> propane tanks can be dropped off at Home Hardware Building Centre - Yarmouth or at the Hardscratch Road Transfer Station. ▶ car bodies, batteries & heavy car parts ▶ garden and yard waste (goes in your organics green cart) ▶ waste oil (<i>May be dropped off at your local service station or at the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) depot at the Transfer Station on Hardscratch Road</i>) ▶ household hazardous wastes such as corrosive cleaners and solvents, strong acids and alkalis, house and garden pesticides (<i>can be taken to the HHW depot on Hardscratch Rd</i>) ▶ electronics (computers, TV's, monitors, printers, telephones, VCR's, DVDS, stereos, digital cameras, etc.) can be taken to the Enviro-Depot, 236-D, Water Street, 742-9747. Please ensure that clean-up waste is placed on property lines at the edge of the public roadway no later than 7:00 am on the day of the collection. As per By-Law S-088-02 "**materials for roadside collection shall be set out no earlier than seven (7) days prior to the special collection.**"

Property owners may choose to drop off separated waste at the transfer station located on the Hardscratch Road (limit of 200 kg/week) but must limit quantities per household, as indicated above, and placed in clear bags.

Refrigerators and freezers that are 10 years and older, between 10 and 25 cubic feet and in working condition are eligible for pick up and rebates from Efficiency Nova Scotia. Non-working appliances do not use electricity, and therefore are not eligible for pick up. To schedule a pickup call **1-877-808-4549**.
